

MINUTES OF THE MORRILTON CITY COUNCIL
REGULAR MEETING
JULY 8, 2019
6:00P.M.

Mayor Lipsmeyer called the regular City Council meeting to order. Pastor Jim Mullins of Bethel Baptist Church offered the prayer, after which the Pledge of Allegiance was repeated in unison. A roll call was taken with six (6) Council Members answering "present." Council Member Payne and Andrews were absent. A quorum was established and the meeting was open for business.

A motion was made by Council Member Hill and seconded by Council Member Spivey to approve the minutes from the regular City Council meeting held June 10, 2019. Motion passed unanimously by a voice vote of "yes" from all Council Members present.

The Mayor acknowledged visitors then asked if anyone not on the agenda wished to address the council. No one came forward.

The Mayor asked for reports from City Council Committees. Council Member Knapp gave the Fire Department and Fire Inspector's report. Park & Rec Director Hanna Jones gave an update on the Community Center and Parks activities. Council Member Hoelzeman gave the Street report. Council Member Spivey gave the Police report. Council Member Bowles gave the Landfill report in absence of Council Member Payne. Council Member Hill reported on the sales tax and the City's financial position as per the Treasurer's Report. Council Member Bowles gave the Tech report. Park & Rec Programs Director Tiffany Hubbard introduced four softball/baseball teams for their recent achievements in the State and District tournaments. Those being recognized were the Rohlman Bratz for winning the 10 and under state championship, Colton Fireballs for being the state runner up for 10 and under, Petit Jean State Bank Glory for winning the 8 and under state championship and the Magie Ford Yankees JRAA for placing second in the state tournament and first place in the district tournament. Mayor Lipsmeyer then gave his report which included updates on the projects and activities going on around the City.

The Mayor asked for old or unfinished business. There was none.

The Mayor then asked for new business.

A resolution was presented and read by the City Attorney designating July 5, 2019, a holiday. A motion was made by Council Member Spivey and seconded by Council Member Hill to pass the

resolution. Motion passed with a voice vote of “yes” from all Council Members present. Resolution No. 7 of 2019 was passed.

There being no further business to discuss, a motion was made by Council Member Hill and seconded by Council Member Bowles to adjourn. Motion passed unanimously with a voice vote of “yes” from all Council Members present.
